

SEASCAPE GALLERY ARTWALK PRE FIELD TRIP ACTIVITY

The Channel Islands Maritime Museum has a world class collection of marine art. You will find works of art that are 2 dimensional or 3 dimensional.

- 2 Dimensional Width and Length (or Height) are paintings that range in time period all the way back to the 1500's.
- 3 Dimensional width, height and depth, are ship models that have been hand made, some dating back to the 1800's by French Prisoners of War and some by modern master craftsmen

You will be amazed at the way the master artists have made the 2 dimensional paintings look like they are 3 dimensional and how the craftsmen who created the ship models were able to make such perfect models of the real ships on such a small scale!





The Seascape Gallery section of the museum houses some of our oldest artwork, dating back to the "Golden Age" of the Dutch Masters. Your docent will tell you about some of the paintings and models you see here, and then will give you some questions to ponder.

You can do some research to prepare for this artwalk and help you to enjoy and learn from the artwork and be better able to consider these questions.
